2019 Annual Children and Youth Report

Sunday School attendance has remained steady with an average range of 8 – 10 children, ranging in ages from 1 year to 11 years old, representing 8 families. On puppet Sundays, we gain more children, as many as 17 which can be challenging. Our wonderful volunteers (Miss Patty and Miss Mary) have been amazing with coordinated crafts and lessons on those days. On the last Sunday of the month, Miss Irene has proven to be a great asset to our discussions with the children. Additional help on the 1st and 3rd Sundays would be greatly appreciated! Ask a partner to share every other month. All planning and supplies are provided; bring your heart and hands to help support our little ones.

Each week we review the Gospel, how it applies to family and friends and the local community, through guided discussion. Crafts and games are included to reinforce the theme of the week.

Our Children's Christmas Story was an interactive retelling of the Friendly Beasts, an old English Carol. Costumes for the animals (donkey, cow, sheep and dove) in the stable were chosen and the part each played in the Savior's birth was shared with the congregation.

SOL's partnership with Oceanway Elementary gives us a chance to offer support for children in need by donating school supplies, Undie Sunday and the Angel Tree. This year, Our members made Christmas possible for 18 families and 33 children. Each child received gifts of clothing a toy, a book and hand-made stockings (Thank you, Miss Kristina) filled with coloring book and crayons, Christmas puzzles or crafts, a bit of candy and a reminder of the Reason for the Season. Thanks to the Food Pantry, we were blessed with a bag of apples and oranges for each child, as well. The School Secretary, Miss Roberta, shared anecdotes of heartfelt thanks and tearful appreciation by the recipient families. She was extremely thankful that our church has been faithfully supportive for a goodly number of years.

VBS 2019, Superheroes had 28 children registered, with an average of 20 attending daily. Approximately 30% were parish family members, and 70% were new friends. SOL's enthusiastic support by donations of time, talent and supplies make this annual event an amazing opportunity to share God's Love with our church family along with the children in our area.
