Our client numbers are around 1900 for the month of October. We took the week of elections off to give everyone a break. We'll be back on the 9th helping those in need.


We can use the following items: canned vegetables, pasta sauce, and tuna. Food Pantry could also use a few cases of water for our workers.

The Patch told us several locations decided not to have their usual deliveries. We decided to continue with the pumpkin delivery since the Patch had been faithful to us we wanted to return the favor. As you know the pumpkins were supposed to be delivered October 10th, but we received them on October 19th. The driver arrived at 8 am for us to begin unloading at noon. Our unloading team of 10 was mighty and consisted of Pastor K, Dawn Martin, Vonda Miller, Bob Schneck, Debby & Al Speicher, Mike & Maggie Spruill, David & Peggy Williams. It was a balmy 80+ degrees, by 3 pm we had only unloaded 1/2 of the truckload and were exhausted. But God always provides! Debby shouted out to her new neighbors and 3 young bloods arrived along with some gentlemen that Debby picked up from Saved by the Sea. We all completed the unloading process within an hour.

This was our 10th consecutive year of operating the Pumpkin Patch and we had our most successful one to date. Every year our neighbors tell us how they have come to the Patch every year and even shared pictures they have taken every year. What a blessing to be able to bring joy into the heart of someone.

But hard work does pay off and our final sales were \$13,052. Since we sold over 9K, we got to keep 33.3% of the profits. We received \$448.55 in donations and sticker sales, which we retain 100% of this money. Since the offerings have not returned to prior COVID standards we decided the profits this year would be used towards paying the expenses needed operate the church. Every year the Patch is hard work, but the memories and rewards are priceless. it gave us all an opportunity to fellowship with our community.

We look forward to an even bigger and better Pumpkin Patch set up next year. Once again we couldn't have done it without you!

Dear Partners,



STEWARDSHIP

What is stewardship? Stewardship is the prayerful work of managing our time, talent and treasure to bring about God's kingdom on earth. In the Bible, stewardship is another way of talking about how you live your life. In the [New Testament books](#), the word "steward" is rooted in the Greek word "oikonomos," which means "the manager of a household".

Has someone ever asked you to watch their kids? Are you responsible for managing an office or people on behalf of an employer? Do you have a financial advisor overseeing your investments? If you answered yes to any of these three questions, then you are or have been a steward.

In general, to steward is to manage something on someone's behalf. Whether a family member, friend, or employer asks you to watch over something, then you're stewarding—managing—whatever they entrusted to your care.

If you were a steward in Ancient Greek culture, you were not the owner of the house. Instead you would have been the manager of the house and the household affairs. From making sure the home was clean to managing the finances and perhaps servants, you would have managed everything on behalf of the owner.

Stewardship in the Bible has to do with understanding that your life is not your own. Your life is on loan from God—regardless if you acknowledge this or not—and God calls you to steward everything about your life for his glory and the good of others.

What is a pledge? A pledge is your commitment to make a financial gift that supports the mission of Spirit of Life Lutheran Church. It is a response to God's call and abundance in our own lives; it is a statement of thanksgiving.

Why do we need annual pledges? How can I trust that the money I give will be spent wisely? Annual pledges support everything we do and are at Spirit of Life. Your gift is spent on all aspects of our worship, outreach, and community life, including our services held each year— including Lent and Advent.

In order to know what we can do each year; we need to receive pledge commitments to develop an annual budget. Don't the contributions made in the weekly offering cover our expenses? Weekly non-pledge offerings amount to approximately 3% of our annual budgeted revenue. The single most important source of funding for our ministries, however, comes from the payment of pledges made during our annual stewardship campaign. These gifts provide most of the church's income.

How many pledges a year do we get? Do people pledge large amounts? We are grateful for every pledge, large and small, that allows us to plan our commitments. In 2020, 29 households pledged regular support to Spirit of Life Church. The average pledge was \$202/month. Last year, we received \$97,240 in pledges and our proposed budget was \$147,105. All pledges of all amounts are critical to help support a 2021 budget.

How much should I give with an annual pledge? We believe strongly that our standard of giving should reflect our standard of living. We ask each member to consider making a pledge that is both responsible and significant based on his or her financial situation. A tithe (10% of your income) has long been held as the standard of Christian giving. For most it is a goal to be reached through incremental increases each year. At Spirit of Life, every pledge, no matter what amount, makes a valued contribution to our mission and ministry.

Five Types of Church Members Who will or DID Not Return after the Quarantine

It is one of the most common questions we get from church leaders: When will all the church members return to in-person services?

Leaders do not like my response: Never.

It is a reality church leaders and members are hesitant to accept. For most churches, not all the church members who were attending before the pandemic will return. In fact, our anecdotal conversations with church members and church leaders indicate somewhere between 20 percent and 30 percent of the members will not return to your church.

From an attendance perspective, if 20 percent of a church with a pre-pandemic attendance of 200 do not return, the new reality attendance will be 160 in attendance after everyone feels safe to return. You can do the math for your own church.

So, who are these non-returning church members? Why are they not returning? Here are the five most common dropout groups. The groups are not mutually exclusive; there could be significant overlap.

1. **The decreasing attendance members.** These were your members who, at one time, attended church almost four times a month. Before the pandemic, their frequency of attendance declined to twice a month or even once a month. COVID accelerated their trends. They are now attending zero times a month.
2. **The disconnected church members.** If a church member is in a small group, his or her likelihood of returning is high. If they attend worship only, their likelihood of attendance is much lower. Please let this reality be a strong motivation to emphasize in-person small groups once everyone feels safe to return.
3. **The church-is-another-activity church members.** These church members see gathered attendance as yet another activity on par, or lower, than other activities. They were the church members who let inclement weather keep them from church but not their children's Sunday soccer games. Commitment to the church was a low priority before the pandemic. They have no commitment in the post-quarantine era.
4. **The constant-critic church members.** These church members always had some complaints for the pastor. In fact, your pastor may be dying a death by a thousand cuts. They are likely still complaining even though they have not returned to in-person services. Many of them will not return at all.

5. **The cultural Christian church members.** They were part of a declining group well before the pandemic. They were those church members who likely were not Christians but came to church to be accepted culturally. Today, there are few cultural expectations for people to attend church. These cultural Christians learned during the pandemic that it was no big deal to miss church. It will be no big deal for them never to return.

Church leaders and church members, however, should not fret about these losses. Your local church has the opportunity to write its future on a blank slate, and these church members really had no plans to be a part of that future anyway.

You may feel the pain of the losses; that is normal. But God has a plan for your church to embrace the new reality to which you are headed. Head into His future with confidence. God's got your church. And He's got you.
